These 10 cases constitute 13 per cent of the 75 mothers at home (7-2 at home plus 3 at work in mill and later at home). Comparing further the per cent of stillbirths traceable to sickness or ill health of the mother, there were 12 cases among mothers at work, constituting 22 per cent of the total for whom reports were received, and 20 cases among mothers at home, constituting 27 per cent of the total mothers at home. These comparisons would seem to indicate that so far as stillbirths were traceable to a cause the work of the mother in the mill and sickness or ill health of the mother so employed were not responsible for stillbirths in any greater degree among the mothers at work than among the mothers at home.
